## Crews Complete West Side of Perris Boulevard Bridge

Construction crews completed the west side of the Perris Boulevard bridge over I-215 and opened this new roadway to motorists on January 28. Work is under way now on the east side of the bridge, which is expected to be complete by the end of 2014.

A five-day closure of the bridge was needed to allow crews to complete the west side of the bridge and switch traffic to the new structure; pedestrian access was maintained. Building the bridge in phases allows motorist access to be maintained as much as possible and avoids the need for a long-term bridge closure.



Perris Boulevard Bridge

The Perris Boulevard bridge is one of the key elements of the Riverside County Transportation Commission's Interstate 215 Central Project, which started in early 2013 and is expected to be complete by mid-2015. The project will add one northbound lane and one southbound lane to I-215 between Scott Road in Menifee and Nuevo Road in Perris. Completion of the first half of the bridge was a major milestone for the project.

## What to Expect in 2014

Construction is progressing steadily on other project activities, including widening the roadway, improving bridges and building retaining walls and sound walls along the corridor. See below for upcoming 2014 construction work.

Estimated Timing	Construction Activity
Spring – Fall	Complete Ethanac, San Jacinto River and Salt Creek bridges Begin I-215 outside widening: 74-East to Nuevo Road
Fall	Open new D Street bridge and on-ramp Complete I-215 inside widening: Scott Road to 74-East
Fall – Winter	Complete east side of Perris Bridge; shift traffic to new roadway
